BEFORE you start your program...

- Review your program's dates, deadlines, and requirements. Be sure to carefully review course descriptions, sequences, practicum/internship, testing, graduation requirements, etc.
- Meet all deadlines and be professional in all of your written and verbal communication.
- Research the certification/licensure requirements in your <u>state</u>/country.

DURING your program...

- Be intentional about professional and respectful communication and collaboration with everyone including your professors, supervisors, advisors, and program support staff.
